It's a small charity based in Kingston whose mission is to nurture happy, healthy, creative and resilient individuals and communities that respect and live within the limits of the planet.

It was founded nearly 30 years ago by Des Kay, also known as Professor Kayoss - who in his own words is a 'master of the dustbin, the skip, the yard sale, the school jumble, and the odd pile of stuff in the road' and is naturally an inspiring educator of the recycling and environmental message, that we at Wanstor share too.



The Charity is involved in lots of activities, most notably though, at the end of every day Des collects any leftover food from all the local supermarkets and re-distributes it to those most in need such as the YMCA, Kingston Churches Action on Homelessness, Homeless centres, local social housing community centres etc....



For this he needs a reliable mode of transport, which is where we come in. We've donated a brand new electric van to the Charity so they can continue their fabulous work efficiently and reliably.

The Charity also has 'The Circulatory' - a warehouse storing a vast quantity of rescued goods that would have otherwise been landfilled, which are now being redistributed, re-used, repaired or upcycled into creative objects.
